

(2) If benefits have been paid with respect thereto.

(3) Unless the individual was eligible for benefits in all respects, except for the requirements of this subsection, of subsection (d) of Section 3 and of subsection (e) of Section 5.

Section 4. That Chapter 4, Section 4 (e), Extraordinary Session Laws of Alaska, 1937, as amended by Chapter 1 and 51, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939, as amended by Chapter 40, Session Laws of Alaska, 1941, be amended to read as follows:

Section 4 (e) He has during his base period earned wages for employment by employers equal to not less than One hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00).

Section 5. The provisions of this Act shall affect only claims filed in benefit years established after October 1, 1946.

CHAPTER 33

AN ACT

[H. B. 27]

To make housing available for Veterans of World War II who are enrolled in Educational institutions in the Territory, under Public Law 16, 78th Congress; making an appropriation and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. POLICY. It is the intention of the

Legislature by this Act to make available to Veterans of World War II who are enrolled in educational institutions in Alaska such housing accommodations as are now or may hereafter be declared surplus property in Alaska by the Armed Forces of the United States.

Duties of
Housing
Authority.

Section 2. ADMINISTRATION. It shall be the duty of the Alaska Housing Authority, under its rules and in compliance with law, to carry out the intent and purpose of this Act and to administer the revolving fund hereinafter authorized and established. It shall also be the duty of the Authority to cooperate with the Federal Government in matters of mutual concern pertaining to the housing of veterans who are students under the benefits of Public Law 16 of Seventy-eighth Congress and regulations promulgated thereunder; to make such reports in the premises as the Administrator of Veterans' affairs may require; and to cooperate as indicated with the Federal Veterans' Administration, its agencies or instrumentalities, and to receive and expend all funds and receive, utilize and maintain real or personal property made available to the Authority by any department or agency of the Federal Government, the Government of Alaska or any municipality.

Revolving Fund.

Section 3. REVOLVING FUND. There is hereby created the Housing Authority Veterans' Fund to be composed of the money hereinafter appropriated.

Surplus housing
to be bought.

Section 4. USE OF FUND. The fund may be used for the purchase by the Authority from the Armed Forces of the United States, at authorized discount, such surplus quonset huts and other structures as may be suitable for student or family housing in the vicinity of any educational institution in Alaska in which World War II Veterans are enrolled as students

under Public Law 16, Seventy-eighth Congress, and are unable to obtain suitable housing for themselves, or themselves and respective families, as the case may be. The authority to purchase hereunder shall include household furnishings. The money may also be used on a matching fund basis under Public Law 16 for any property suitable to carry out the purpose hereof. After such living quarters are obtained by the Authority and made ready for occupancy, same shall be rented to tenants on such rental prices, terms and conditions as may be deemed by the Authority to be fair and equitable both to the tenant and to the Territory. While a housing shortage lasts in any such vicinity, the Veterans of World War II above indicated who apply to rent such quarters shall have top priority. Other students will come next and then other tenants if such quarters be then vacant. If a housing shortage ceases in any such community, the Authority shall offer such huts and/or other structures and furnishings for sale either at private or public sale as the Authority may deem to be the most lucrative to the Territory. Disbursements hereunder shall be in the usual manner of disbursing Territorial money.

Section 5. REVENUES. All rentals or monies received on capital liquidations, or otherwise, forthcoming hereunder, shall be turned over to the Territorial Treasurer for deposit in the Housing Authority Veterans' Fund.

Revenue covered into fund. Report.

Section 6. REPORTS. The Authority shall prepare and present a biennial report of this program to the Legislature not later than ten days after the convening thereof.

Appropriation.

Section 7. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$100,000.00 for deposit in the

Housing Authority Veterans' Fund, to be used for the purposes of this Act.

Section 8. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 34

AN ACT

[H. B. 39]

To define the terms "Basic Sciences," "Practicing Healing" and "Practice of Healing," as used herein: to regulate within the Territory the practice of healing as so defined, prescribe the terms and conditions upon which the same may be pursued and prohibit all persons from in any manner engaging therein within the Territory, except in compliance with such terms and conditions; to establish a Territorial Board of Examiners in the "Basic Sciences" as defined herein, define its powers, prescribe its duties, provide for the appointment of its members and fix their terms and compensation; and in certain respects defining the powers and prescribing the duties of Boards for any branch or system of healing, now existing or hereafter established, and of certain other officers; and providing for the enforcement of this Act and penalties for its violation; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Wherever the term "Basic Sciences" is used in this Act and not otherwise specifically defined, the same shall be understood and construed to mean and include all matters pertaining to anatomy, physiology, pathology, bacteriology, hygiene or chemistry, so far as the same relates to the human system or mind
