

## CHAPTER 18

## AN ACT

[S. B. 30]

To provide a general Savings Clause applicable to present and future legislation in all matters civil and criminal.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That the repeal or amendment of any statute shall not affect any offense committed or any act done or right accruing or accrued or any action or proceeding had or commenced prior to such repeal or amendment; nor shall any penalty, forfeiture or liability incurred under such statute be released or extinguished, but the same may be enforced, continued, sustained, prosecuted and punished under the repealing or amendatory statute save as limited by the ex post facto and other provisions of the Constitution, in which event the same may be enforced, continued, sustained, prosecuted and punished under the former law as if such repeal or amendment had not been made.

## CHAPTER 19

## AN ACT

[S. B. 26]

To re-enact the subject matter of Section 2099 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1913, repealed by Chapter 17, Session Laws of Alaska, 1933, relating to applicability of the Common Law in Alaska.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That the Common Law of England as adopted and understood in the United States in regard to criminal matters shall be in force in Alaska except as modified by statutory law of the Territory.

## CHAPTER 20

### AN ACT

[S. B. 50]

To repeal Sections 2261 to 2270, inclusive, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relating to the office of Commissioner of Transportation for Prospectors.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Sections 2261 to 2270, inclusive, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, are hereby repealed.

## CHAPTER 21

### AN ACT

[S. B. 53]

To amend Section 3 of Chapter 8, Session Laws of Alaska, 1943, relating to jurisdiction of child custody cases.
