

## CHAPTER 2

## AN ACT

[H. B. 81]

To secure an expression of the opinion of the voters of the Territory of Alaska on the question whether the practice of fishing by means of fish traps should be abolished.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That there shall be submitted to the voters of the Territory of Alaska at the next general election the question whether fishing by means of fish traps should be abolished gradually over a period of ten years from the date of approval of legislation authorizing such action.

Section 2. There shall be given to each voter at said general election a separate ballot in substantially the following form:

## REFERENDUM BALLOT

The practice of fishing by means of fish traps within the Territory of Alaska should be gradually abolished over a ten year period by appropriate legislation.

Form of

The practice of fishing by means of fish traps should be continued.

Section 3. The negative of the proposal as provided for in Section 2 shall be printed at the top in one-half of the ballots and the affirmative at the top in the other half, and an equal number of each form of ballot shall be distributed in each of the voting precincts.

Section 4. The returns of the election shall be canvassed in the manner prescribed for general elections and the results shall be certified and transmitted by the Secretary of the Territory of Alaska to the Legislature at the next regular session in January 1949 in order that it may take such action as may be necessary in conformance with the result of the Referendum.

### CHAPTER 3

#### AN ACT

[S. B. 12]

To amend Section 1378, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relating to the school age of children.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Section 1378, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1378. SCHOOL AGE DEFINED. Any child who is six years of age or who will become six years of age on or before the first day of November next following the beginning of the school year shall be considered a child of school age. A child under school age shall not be received into any department of a public school, except a kindergarten.
