

CHAPTER 39

AN ACT

[H. B. 67]

To amend Chapter 33, Session Laws of Alaska Ex. 1946, on the subject of providing housing for Veterans of World War II who are enrolled in educational institutions in the Territory of Alaska, with assistance from the Federal Government under Public Laws 16 and 346, 78th Congress, or other Federal enactments hereafter provided; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 1 of Ch. 33 S.L.A. Ex. 1946 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. POLICY. It is the intention of the Legislature by this Act to make housing accommodations available to Veterans of World War II who are enrolled in educational institutions in Alaska. This contemplates the utilization, for such purpose, of housing facilities which are now or may hereafter be declared surplus property in Alaska by the Armed Forces of the United States or otherwise available.

Outline of policy.

Section 2. Section 2 of Ch. 33 S.L.A. Ex. 1946 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. ADMINISTRATION. It shall be the duty of the Alaska Housing Authority, under its rules and in compliance with law, to carry out the intent and purpose of this Act and to administer the revolving fund hereinafter authorized and established. It shall also be the duty of the Authority to cooperate with the

administer.

Federal Government in matters of mutual concern pertaining to the housing of veterans who are students under the benefits of Public Laws 16 and 346 of the Seventy-eighth Congress and regulations promulgated thereunder; in which connection contracts with the Federal Public Housing Authority, or other agencies, in accordance with recognized procedure under Public Law 292, 79th Congress, Public Law 336, 79th Congress, or any other pertinent law, are hereby authorized; to make such reports in the premises as the Administrator of Veterans' Affairs may require; and to cooperate in matters of Veterans' housing with the Federal Veterans' Administration, its agencies or instrumentalities, and to receive funds from whatever sources and expend all funds including Territorial appropriations for acquisition and improvement of sites, structures, conversion of same, and for payment of administrative costs in developing or operating any veterans' housing project, and receive, utilize and maintain real or personal property made available to the Authority by any department or agency of the Federal Government, the Government of Alaska or any municipality.

Sources of funds.

Section 3. Section 4 of Ch. 33 S.L.A. Ex. 1946 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 4. USE OF FUND. The fund may be used for the purchase by the Authority of real or personal property from any source, but the Authority is directed to avail itself so far as possible of money-saving purchases from the Armed Forces of the United States or other Federal Agencies, at authorized discount, of such surplus quonset huts and other structures as may be suitable for student or family housing, any property purchased to be in the vicinity of

any educational institution in Alaska in which World War II Veterans are enrolled as students under Public Laws 16 and 346, Seventy-eighth Congress, and are unable to obtain suitable housing for themselves, or themselves and respective families, as the case may be. The authority to purchase hereunder shall include household furnishings. The money may also be used on a matching fund basis under any Federal program compatible with achieving the purposes of this Act. After such living quarters are obtained by the Authority and made ready for occupancy by conversion, installation of utilities, etc., same shall be rented to tenants on such rental prices, terms and conditions as may be deemed by the Authority to be fair and equitable both to the tenant and to the Territory. While a housing shortage lasts in any such vicinity, the Veterans of World War II above indicated who apply to rent such quarters shall have top priority. Other students will come next and then other tenants if such quarters be then vacant. If a housing shortage ceases in any such community, the Authority shall offer such huts and/or other structures and furnishings for sale either at private or public sale as the Authority may deem to be the most lucrative to the Territory. Disbursements hereunder shall be in the usual manner of disbursing Territorial money.

Section 4. Section 5 of Ch. 33 S.L.A. Ex. 1946 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 5. REVENUES. All rentals except as payable to the Federal Government under contract covering Federally provided units, or monies received on capital liquidations, except sales and removal of Federally built structures,

or otherwise, forthcoming hereunder, shall be turned over to the Territorial Treasurer for deposit in the Housing Authority Veterans' Fund, subject to withdrawal for further use in carrying out the purposes of this Act.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval. ^{Emergency clause.}

CHAPTER 40

AN ACT

[H. B. 18]

To amend Sections 1 and 2 of Chapter 8 of the Session Laws of Alaska 1946, pertaining to teachers' salaries.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Chapter 8 of the Session Laws of Alaska 1946 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. The Territorial Board of Education and school boards of school districts in the Territory of Alaska shall pay teachers, regularly qualified in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Territorial Board of Education and employed by them within the following salary ranges: For the First Division, Three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) to Four thousand four hundred dollars (\$4,400.00); Third Division, Three
