under oath to the Territorial Banking Board by the president, cashier or treasurer of such bank. Any such president, cashier, treasurer or any officer of such bank, or any person whosever, whether an officer of the bank or not, who shall make and file or cause or permit to be made or filed or who shall knowingly aid, abet, encourage or assist any such person to make or file with the Territorial Banking Board any certificate required by this section which shall be false in whole or in part shall be punished by a fine of not less than one thousand dollars nor more than five thousand dollars, or by imprisonment in the penitentiary not less than one year nor more than five years, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

CHAPTER 55

AN ACT

[F. C. C. S. S. B. 28]

To amend Sections 652, 654, 655 and Section 669, as amended, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933; and to repeal Section 670, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, pertaining to the office of Attorney General and Assistant Attorney General; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 652, Compiled Laws of Alaska 1933, is hereby amended by substituting the word "April" for the word "January" appearing in Line 7 thereof.

Section 2. That Section 654, Compiled Laws of Alaska 1933, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 654. COMPENSATION; HOW PAID; EXPENSES. The salary of the Attorney General shall be five thousand six hundred dollars per annum, which shall be paid in equal monthly installments upon vouchers drawn upon the funds appropriated for that purpose. He shall be provided with an office located in the capital of the Territory, and contingent office expense, including necessary clerical assistance, stamps and stationery, and travel expense and per diem when absent from the capital on business within the Territory of Alaska and on business of the Territory outside Alaska, provided authority for such travel without the Territory shall be obtained from the Board of Administration and that a full and complete accounting of all travel expenses shall be attached to the voucher.

Section 3. That Section 655, Compiled Laws of Alaska 1933, be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 655. NO OTHER EMPLOYMENT; RESIDENCE. The Attorney General shall not engage in any other business nor accept any other professional employment. He shall reside during his term of office at the Capital.

Section 4. That Section 669, Compiled Laws of Alaska 1933, as amended by Chapter 72, Session Laws of Alaska, 1941, is hereby amended by substituting the words "Five Thousand Five Hundred Dollars" for the words "Four Thousand Dollars" appearing in line sixteen of said section.

Salary of assistant.

Section 5. That Section 670, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, is hereby repealed.

Emergency.

Section 6. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon passage and approval.

CHAPTER 56

AN ACT

[S. B. 101]

To amend Section 3731, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, relating to Notice of Sale on Execution.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That sub-heading "First" of Section 3731, Compiled Laws of Alaska, 1933, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Posting of notice.

"First. In case of personal property, by posting a written or printed notice of the time and place of sale in three public places within five miles of the place where the sale is to be held, not less than ten days prior to the day of sale; one of which notices shall be posted at the post office nearest to the place where the sale is to take place."
