

1, Chapter 20, Special Session Laws of Alaska, 1946, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Subsection 5. Per Diem. Per Diem in lieu of subsistence, will be allowed at the rate of ten dollars (\$10.00) per day, to officials and employees when away from their home or official station, in the Territory's business. In computing per diem in lieu of subsistence, the calendar day shall constitute a per diem period; for fractional parts of a day, at the commencing or ending of continuous travel, constituting a travel period, one fourth of a calendar day will be allowed for each six hours or fraction thereof. For continuous travel of less than twenty-four hours, however, constituting a travel period, such period will be regarded as commencing with the beginning of the travel and ending with the completion thereof and for each six-hour period or fraction thereof, one-fourth of the rate for a calendar day will be allowed when the departure is after 8 a. m. and the return on the same day is prior to 6 p. m.; or for any absence not exceeding three hours.

CHAPTER 66

AN ACT

[H. B. 96]

Authorizing reimbursement of Territorial Highway Patrolmen, A. P. Brandt and Wesley I. Gilman, for their transportation from Whitehorse, Y. T. to Washington, D. C.; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Appropriation.

Section 1. Reimbursement to Territorial Highway Patrolmen, A. P. Brandt and Wesley I. Gilman, for cost to them in the sum of \$232.05 each for their transportation from Whitehorse, Y. T. to Washington, D. C., during the last year, for the dual purpose of attending FBI school and driving new automobiles to Alaska for the Territorial Highway Patrol, is hereby authorized to be paid out of the applicable appropriation for the Highway Engineer, notwithstanding the outside travel restriction contained in Chapter 26, Session Laws of Alaska, 1939.

Emergency clause.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 67

AN ACT

[S. B. 102]

To amend Section 3(a)(2) of Chapter 27, Session Laws of Alaska Ex., 1946, relating to exemption of tax on exports to a foreign country.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the first paragraph of subsection (a) (2) of Chapter 27, Session Laws of Alaska, Ex. 1946, is amended to read as follows:
