HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 11

TO THE U. S. FOREST SERVICE, THE PUBLIC ROADS ADMINISTRATION AND THE TERRITORIAL HIGHWAY ENGINEER:

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Act, approved November 29, 1921, as amended, has contributed immeasurably to the development of roads in the several States and Territories, but has never been extended to Alaska; and,

WHEREAS, lack of a continuing affirmative policy of Federal assistance for construction of roads in Alaska has resulted in important segments of the Territory remaining isolated from the rest thereof; and,

WHEREAS, the residents of Yakutat depend entirely on fishing for their livelihood. One of their best fishing areas is located near Setuck River; reached by traveling on a privately owned railroad or by treacherous water. During the war the Army built a road within four miles of the fishing grounds.

NOW, THEREFORE, your memorialist urges the immediate construction of this four mile section to the Setuck River.
