### HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 31

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR, PUBLIC ROADS ADMINISTRATION, U. S. FOREST SERVICE AND THE DELEGATE FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in eighteenth regular session assembled, respectfully submits:

WHEREAS, there is urgent need for a road from the Alaska Packers Canneries located about one and a half miles north of Wrangell, to a point opposite Mill Creek, a distance of approximately four miles; and,

WHEREAS, the residents of Mill Creek and adjacent area must now depend upon boats for transportation to Wrangell, and at times such transportation is extremely hazardous, particularly for small boats; and,

WHEREAS, such road would give the aforesaid Mill Creek residents access to the sheltered seaplane anchorage; and,

WHEREAS, there is at the present time located at Mill Creek a sawmill and a proposed hydro-electric plant which insures progressive development of the area if adequate transportation be available;

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully prays that steps be taken to build, at the earliest possible time, the road herein specified.

### HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 32

TO THE SECRETARY OF WAR; THE U. S. ENGINEER DEPARTMENT; AND THE DELEGATE FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully represents that:

WHEREAS, the harbor project on the Snake River at Nome, Alaska, which was completed twenty-eight years ago, has served a valuable purpose and assisted in the development of Northwestern Alaska; and,

WHEREAS, due to excessive use during the war and natural causes, the facilities of said harbor have been strenuously taxed, resulting in conditions which call for a review of the project to ascertain what rehabilitation and improvements should be made; and,

WHEREAS, a serious beach erosion problem has developed in the past ten years, recently reaching an alarming proportion which endangers the City of Nome;
