HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 32

TO THE SECRETARY OF WAR; THE U. S. ENGINEER DEPARTMENT; AND THE DELEGATE FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully represents that:

WHEREAS, the harbor project on the Snake River at Nome, Alaska, which was completed twenty-eight years ago, has served a valuable purpose and assisted in the development of Northwestern Alaska; and,

WHEREAS, due to excessive use during the war and natural causes, the facilities of said harbor have been strenuously taxed, resulting in conditions which call for a review of the project to ascertain what rehabilitation and improvements should be made; and,

WHEREAS, a serious beach erosion problem has developed in the past ten years, recently reaching an alarming proportion which endangers the City of Nome;

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in Eighteenth Regular Session assembled, respectfully urges that the repair and improvement of said facilities to accommodate the growing commerce of the Bering Sea, coupled with construction of a breakwater to protect the City of Nome, be treated as a priority project.

HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 33

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR, THE CONGRESS OF
THE UNITED STATES, AND THE DELEGATE FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in Eighteenth Session assembled, respectfully submits:

WHEREAS, the present existing laws prohibit the White Race to own Reindeer in Alaska; and

WHEREAS, the Reindeer herds are fast becoming depleted and unless immediate and appropriate steps are taken the industry will soon become extinct; citing such instances in the Second Judiciary Division of Alaska as Unalakleet, Shaktoolik, Elim, Koyuk, Mountain Village, White Mountain, Council and Nome where large herds once existed, but are now non-existent; and

WHEREAS, this industry is virtually necessary to Alaska and especially the Second Judicial Division; and

WHEREAS, many of the White Race have expressed a desire in this industry; and

WHEREAS, it will encourage Veterans to participate in this worthwhile venture;
