

HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 3

TO THE HONORABLE E. L. BARTLETT, DELEGATE TO CONGRESS FROM ALASKA; AND TO THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, Alaska has potential opportunities for great future industrial development; and

WHEREAS, many and suitable sites needed for these industrial plants, mills and related use, etc., are owned by the United States Government; and

WHEREAS, under present law the General Land Office does not have authority to make over 160 acres available for patent; and

WHEREAS, some of these sites needed are in excess of 160 acres;

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully prays that Congress immediately authorize sale by the General Land Office, of sites in excess of 160 acres needed for industrial plants, mills and related uses.
