AN ACT

Concerning grants and loans for water supply and sewerage systems; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 46.05 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 46.05.155. GRANTS AND LOANS FOR WATER SUPPLY AND SEWERAGE SYSTEMS. (a) The department may pay, as funds are available, 25 per cent of the estimated reasonable cost, as determined by the Secretary of the Interior, of each waste treatment works project approved for a federal grant by the Federal Water Quality Administration or its predecessor, the Federal Water Pollution Control Administration, and on which construction was initiated after June 30, 1967. As funds are available, the department may lend on an interest free basis for a project approved after June 30, 1970, any part of an anticipated federal grant. Money received from the Federal Water Quality Administration for the project after the loan is given must be used to repay the loan, but the loan need be repaid only to the extent of such federal assistance.

(b) The department may pay to any municipality, as funds are available, up to the lesser of 25 per cent of the estimated cost or 50 per cent of the estimated cost not borne by the federal government, if there is federal assistance, of water systems, including collection and impounding facilities, and of those portions of sewerage systems not covered by (a) of this section. The estimated cost of any part of a system will be as determined by the federal agency which gives the most monetary assistance or, if none, by the department. Systems shall be constructed according to plans and specifications approved by the federal agency which gives the most monetary assistance or, if none, by the department.

(c) There is a water supply and sewerage systems fund created in the department to carry out the purposes of this section.

* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.
