AN ACT

Relating to game preserves.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 11.40.510 is amended to read:

Sec. 11.40.510. USE OF LIVE BIRDS AS TARGETS. A person who (1) uses a live pigeon, fowl or other bird as a target, or to be shot at either for amusement or as a test of skill in marksmanship; or (2) shoots at a bird used as a target, for amusement or as a test of skill in marksmanship, or is a party to a shooting; or (3) leases a building, room, field or premises, or knowingly permits the use of them for a shooting, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction is punishable by a fine of not more than \$50. This section does not apply to shooting of game for food or prohibit recreational hunting of game birds on game hunting preserves authorized by the Fish and Game Board under AS 16.05.930(c).

* Sec. 2. AS 16.05.930(c) is amended to read:

(c) Section 920 of this chapter does not prohibit rearing and sale of fish from private ponds, the raising of wild animals in captivity for food or fur purposes or the raising of game birds for the purpose of recreational hunting on game hunting preserves, under regulations promulgated by the board.
