AN ACT

Relating to the exercise of the power of eminent domain by certain municipalities; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 09.55.240 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

(c) Until July 1, 1975, home rule cities of over 50,000 population may exercise eminent domain authority within their boundaries to acquire land for the use of the United States, the State of Alaska or any other political subdivision for governmental office buildings and ancillary improvements, including but not limited to the improvement and landscaping of adjacent grounds, under an agreement entered into under sec. 13, art. X, Constitution of the State of Alaska.

* Sec. 2. AS 09.55.420 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of (a) of this section, until July 1, 1975, a home rule city of over 50,000 population may exercise the power of declaration of taking under sec. 240(c) of this chapter. When the home rule city exercises this power for the United States government, the just compensation paid for the property shall include all relocation and other costs to the extent required by the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Act of 1970 (P.L. 91-646).

* Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.
