ordered.

Mrs. Banfield moved and asked unanimous consent that the
roll call of the House be waived and the record show all
members present. There being no objection, it was so
ordered.

President Miller appointed Senator Ray and Representative
Carrol to escort the Honorable Chief Justice Jay A.
Rabinowitz of the Alaska Supreme Court to and from the
House chamber, and declared the joint session at ease
until the arrival of the Chief Justice.

The Honorable Chief Justice Rabinowitz was escorted to the
rostrum and introduced by President Miller.

Chief Justice Rabinowitz then delivered his message.

Following his message, the Chief Justice received a stand-
ing ovation and once again was escorted from the chamber by
Senator Ray and Representative Carrol. Senator Thomas
moved and asked unanimous consent that the joint session
adjourn. There being no objection, the joint session
adjourned at 11:31 a.m.

The House was ordered at ease to allow members of the
Senate to leave.

The House was called to order at 11:34 a.m.

Mrs. Banfield moved and asked unanimous consent that the
House stand in recess until 1:15 p.m. There being no ob-
jection, the House recessed at 11:35 a.m.
